1. Welcome by Susan Sweet.
2. A motion was made to accept January, 2017 minutes. Amy Broadbent made the motion and Karma Lattin seconded it. All were in favor.
3. Krista Stettler reported for the counselors. Registration for all grades is complete.
  - 7<sup>th</sup> grade will have their Career Day on April 21<sup>st</sup>.
  - 8<sup>th</sup> grade will have Reality Town on April 28<sup>th</sup>.
  - 9<sup>th</sup> grade will have Job Shadow on March 17<sup>th</sup>.
4. Kelly Cragun reported on our next SOAR activity.
  - To qualify, students needed to increase their grade point average by .5, or be on the honor roll.
  - 573 students qualified.
  - Students are going to Rush Fun Zone or they may elect stay at the school and watch a movie.
5. Sue reported on the boundary changes.
  - A map showing the final recommendations of all schools involved was provided to all council members. The recommendation in our area calls for all families residing within the Harrisville City limits and the Pleasant View City limits will attend Weber and Orion Jr. High School.
  - There will be two open houses for the public on February 21, <sup>2017</sup> at Roy High @ 6 p.m., and another on February 23, 2017 at Weber High @ 6 p.m.
  - The final boundary decision will be made by the Weber School District Board of Education at their meeting on March 3, 2017.
  - Boundary exceptions will be available for affected students at their current school. Transportation for student on a boundary exception is the responsibility of the parents.

6. Jordan Reyna has been hired as a new math teacher at WJHS. She replaced Meghann Sjoblom who recently resigned. She is a BYU-I graduate and she did her student teaching last fall at Weber High. We feel very lucky to have her as part of our math team!

7. Trustlands Budget Report.

9. Betsy Halverson gave a report on ALEKS.

- Math teachers utilize this software with every student and feel it is a very valuable tool to reinforce and remediate concepts.
- Students have unlimited attempts to do complete problems and cannot move forward until they master each lesson.
- ALEKS is personalized and unique for each student. The program continually assesses student progress so teachers and provides up-to-date information for teacher review.
- Students are required to complete 10 ALEKS assignments per week—which should take approximately 30 minutes.
- Students earn points as they complete weekly lessons. They are also required to show progress at pre-determined levels each quarter.
